Modification in Eligibility Criteria for Admission to (BAMS/BHMS/BUMS)

Ref : Medical Education & Drugs Department Letter No MED-1025/C.R.No.285/25/Edu-2, Dated 29/07/2025

State Common Entrance Test Cell has published the Government Approved Information Brochure for admission to Under graduate Health Science Course in the Academic Year 2025-26.

Vide above referred letter Government has been amended the rule no.4.6.1 of Eligibility for the BAMS/ BHMS/ BUMS courses. Revised rule 4.6.1.1 is as follows.

	A candidate belonging to OPEN Category and EWS Category must have obtained not less than 50% (i.e. 150 out of 300) marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together at the HSC (or equivalent) Examination. A candidate belonging to constitutional reservation, SEBC, constitutional reservation with PWD claim and SEBC with PWD claim must have obtained not less than 40% (i.e. 120 out of 300) marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together at the HSC (or equivalent) Examination. Person with disability (PWD) candidate in General category must secure not less than 45% marks (i.e. 135 out of 300) in Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) taken together at the HSC (or equivalent) Examination or as decided by the respective Central Council from time to time.	Minimum marks percentage eligibility criteria mentioned for all categories in regulation as per National Commissions for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and National Homoeopathy Commission (NCH) stands withdrawn. Therefore, eligibility criteria for admission to undergraduate Ayurveda/Homoeopathy/Unani course is: "The candidate shall have passed 10+2 (or equivalent) with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Biotechnology." There is no change for MBBS/BDS course.

In view of the schedule published vide notice no.01, candidats who were not eligible earlier and filled the form only for Group C will be permitted for choice/preference filling for Group B (if now eligible) as per the schedule.

Candidate should follow our website for schedule of Group B (BAMS/BHMS/BUMS) and Group C (BNYS/BPTH/BOTH/BASLP/BP&O) which will be published in due course.

All the concern candidates and Intitutions should take note of this.
